Update about St. Mary's School staying closed:



As a school in Idaho (with a childcare program), we are required to follow the guidelines of: Governor Little, State Board of Education, the Diocese of Boise and our insurance company, Catholic Mutual.

We are in Stage One (May 1-15) of the guidelines: no more than 10 may gather

Social distancing of 6 feet

Stage Two (May 16-May 29) no more than 10 may gather

Social distancing of 6 feet

Stage Three (May 30-June 12) 10 to 50 may gather

Social distancing of 6 feet

Stage Four (June 13-26) more than 50 may gather

Social distancing of 6 feet

To move from one stage to the next, there **must not be** any increase in the coronavirus disease; in fact, the disease must be on a *downward spiral*.

Information from Father Joe regarding Masses per Bishop Peter: "Governor Little worked with the Department of Health and Welfare and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to create a four-stage process for opening up Idaho's economy. The first stage begins on May 1st and allows our parishes to open for public liturgies once more, if they adhere to strict physical distancing, sanitation protocol, and any CDC guidance."

So as of this weekend all Masses will be held at the School Gym at the following times:

Saturday, May 2nd. 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, May 3rd. 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. (note this a change from 11:30)

Please remember no one is obliged to attend Mass if they *do not feel comfortable doing so*. If you do choose to attend Mass, we ask that you please *wear a mask and be mindful of social distancing protocols*.

Further Fr. Joe states: "On the bright side, in addition to weekend Masses, **Daily Masses** are resuming Tuesday-Friday, starting May 4th. at 8:00 a.m. daily in the church."
